Short Description

This is a introductory course that assumes no prior knowledge of psychology. The course is designed to give students an introduction to social behaviour which takes place between people and groups. The course will examine why people are highly sociable individuals who live in communities and develop their interpersonal behaviours. Many experiments in social psychology demonstrate individuals' abilities to form social interactions in which they rely on cognitive and affective processes. Entering into interpersonal relations individuals are able to make an impact on others in social, cultural and political areas. The will enable students to acquire basic competence in preparing and interpreting social behaviour.

The teaching methods will encompass: lectures, multimedia presentations, discussions, working in small groups.
